#### School attendance & lateness

Why is school attendance important in NZ?

Attendance affects achievement. The evidence shows that attendance is directly related to how well learners achieve. The more learners attend, the higher their achievement and the more learning traction they will gain. There is no safe level of non-attendance, even missing just a few days a term can be linked to lower achievement. This applies to lateness also. Vital learning and setting up for the day occurs in the morning when teachers brief their students on what is happening and prepare them for their day. Consistent lateness leads to a child feeling unprepared and rushed, which may mean they take longer to settle or focus on their learning. The mornings are the most efficient time for young minds to absorb and retain new learning. Thanks to those parents and caregivers who are ensuring their child is on time for the start of school. If you know your child is likely to be absent for a few days for reasons other than sickness, please talk with your child's teacher on how best to continue to support them with their learning until they return to school. Each day of learning at school builds on the next. It is cumulative, so each day matters. Children learn in different ways and at different speeds but individual progress is dependent on frequent school attendance.

Please inform the office if your child is absent or if you are doing an early pick up from school. Also, advise the office of any changes to emails, phone numbers or addresses.



#### **ARRIVING AFTER 8.45AM**

Although we discourage children arriving late, children need to report to the school office if they arrive after school starts at 8.45am. Office staff will issue children with a late pass for the class teacher then electronically mark the child as present.

It's vital that children are here on time, ready to start the day before the 8.45am bell goes.

#### STUDENTS LEAVING DURING CLASS TIME

**BEFORE COLLECTING YOUR CHILD**: ALL parents and caregivers must report to the school office and collect a pass if you are collecting your child early or taking your child out briefly for an appointment. Please have your child report back in at the office when they return. If you have arranged for someone else to collect your child during school hours, who would NOT normally do so, please contact the school well in advance of their arrival otherwise we will need to call you to verify this arrangement BEFORE releasing your child.

Pukenui Rooms 8,10,11,12	Breakfast / Spreads / Drink items	Breakfast cereals in packets - cornflakes, weetbix, rice bubbles, muesli, oats, instant porridge packets.  Spreads - peanut butter, jam, marmite, vegemite, nutella Drinks - Coffee, Tea, Milo
Hatea Rooms 1,2,3,4	Packet Foods	Pasta, soup mixes, ready-made food mixes (just add water), noodles, rice, rice cups, rice risotto, macaroni cheese, instant mashed potatoes in a bag.
<b>Kauika</b> Rooms 13,14,15,16	Food for lunch boxes	Muslie bars, fruit jelly cups, snack foods-small bags of chips, biscuits, crackers etc. Raisins, dried fruit etc that are already packaged into smaller bags.
Parihaka Rooms 9,17,18,19	Toiletries	Toothbrushes, toothpaste, body wash, shampoo, conditioner, washing powder (Rosie is prepared to bag these into smaller portions.)
<b>Manaia</b> Rooms 20,21,22,23	Canned Food	Not so much baked beans or spaghetti-needing canned tuna, salmon, pasta sauces (canned or glass jar), soups, casseroles in a can (beef stew), canned vegetables, creamed rice, canned fruit.
